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GPP ON LINE TRAINING COURSE READY TO BE TESTED

STRUCTURE



The duration of GPP-Furniture training course is 50 hours and is divided into three interrelated modules:

<u>Module 1</u>— Basic aspects of Public Procurement and Public Procurement of Innovation.

<u>Module 2</u> — Green Public Procurement. <u>Module 3</u> — Green technologies and materials applicable in the furniture sector.

OBJECTIVE



The participants in the course will learn what is public procurement, main aspects of the green public procurement, how to bid for public procurement tenders, and the last green technologies and materials that can be applied in the furniture sector.

METHODOLOGY

Each module is composed by several units where the participants will find:

- **Videos**: one or more explicative videos. There are two kind of videos: animated videos and presentations with voice in off.
- **Slides**: support presentation on the addressed topic.
- Scripts: link to the pdf of the video script.
- **Exercises**: different optional exercises to support your training and the acquisition of the new knowledge.
- **Additional materials**: at the end of each module, you will find the section "To know more", where you can find links to additional materials.

TARGET AUDIENCE

- The audience includes Providers (managers and workers of companies); Buyers (policy makers, staff of public authorities) and Neutral (professionals; students and unemployed).

LANGUAGES



The online course is available on www.gpp-furniture.eu. It is free of charge and is accessible in English, Bulgarian, Spanish, Romanian and Polish languages

ASSESSMENT



- In case of passing 100% of the GPP-Furniture training course, students can obtain a maximum of 2 ECVET credits.
- At the end of each module the students find a final assessment with 10 questions about the whole module.
- The students have 3 attempts to pass the assessment. They need 60% of correct answers to pass the assessment and get a Module certificate.

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Fifth meeting in Zaragoza, Spain
