WHAT'S THE LATEST? EU NEWS YOU CAN USE

What does the Seventh Framework Programme means for Europe?

Brussels, 21 September 2005: 70 billion euros for the next 7 years of European research is what it means. The amount proposed by the European Commission is a worthwhile investment in Europe's future.

Figures already exist showing that European research programmes have an effect on economic and employment growth. But what is their effect at the level of companies, universities, research institutes? What is Europe risking if it doesn't invest more in European research?

Missed opportunities. A look at the recent past will help to understand why the European Commission considers investing more in research is necessary for Europe's future. In the past, Europe has missed opportunities in key research areas such as nuclear safety, food contamination, Alzheimer, terrestrial biosphere protection and road tunnel safety, simply due to a lack of available funds. The funding available under FP6 has allowed no more than 15% of all project proposals to be funded, leaving many excellent and innovative projects without funding.

Past success. These missed opportunities do not mean that the European research framework programmes have failed. On the contrary, the programmes have substantially contributed to addressing many of society's major challenges in key areas.

Who and what will be funded? The European Commission, on the basis of the previous framework programme assessments and indicators,

estimates that the doubling of the research budget would

- · create 220,000 new research posts through the participation of Universities and Research Institutes in FP7 funded research projects, compared to 70,000 in FP6
- · result in more than 20,000 contracts, compared to 7,500-8,500 in FP6
- · involve over 200,000 participants, compared to 75,000-83,000 in FP6
- \cdot fund 15,000 or more fellowships, compared to 4,500-5,500 in FP6

More support for SMEs, Europe's potential powerhouse. Small and medium-sized enterprises are a tremendous source of innovation and growth potential for the future. The Seventh Framework Programme seeks to make the most of this potential by proposing measures to increase the participation of SMEs in research projects, and to develop systems for their increased access to research results. There is certainly a will on the part of SMEs to get involved - almost 70% of proposals received from SMEs and evaluated as excellent do not receive funding due to a lack of resources. Assuming that the average project size remains the same, a doubling of the research budget will allow the direct financing of an additional 500 SMEs every year.

Innovation starts here. In its Seventh Framework Programme, the European Commission has proposed a number of innovative instruments, which respond to the challenges faced by those carrying out research in Europe. These include a Risk-sharing Finance Facility, a European Research Council (ERC), and Joint Technology Initiatives.



Environment: Commission supports 89 innovation projects in 17 countries with €71 million

Brussels, 19 September 2005: The European Commission has approved funding for 89 environmental innovation projects in 17 countries under the LIFE-Environment programme 2005. These projects will demonstrate new methods and techniques for dealing with a wide diversity of environmental problems, thus contributing to improving Europe's environment. They represent a total investment of €220 million, of which the EU will provide €71 million.

This year, the Commission received 534 proposals for funding through the LIFE-Environment programme from a wide range of public and private organisations. The Commission selected 89 of these projects, all of which will apply groundbreaking technology to solve environmental problems.

Waste management takes the lead this year in terms of the number of projects selected (31) and of the EU funding allocated (€27 million, representing 39% of the total). Minimising the environmental impact of economic activities is the second most popular theme with 22 projects (€17 million). Almost one-fifth of the EU funding (€14 million) will be allocated to 17 projects dealing with the sustainable management of groundwater and surface water. Twelve projects deal with sustainable land-use development and planning and will share around €9 million (i.e. 10%) of the EU funding available. Finally, seven projects address the reduction of the environmental impacts of products and services (€5 million).

LIFE Third Countries 2005: Commission funds environment projects in third countries with more than €6 million

Brussels, 19 September 2005: The European Commission has approved funding for 15 new environment projects situated in the Mediterranean and Baltic regions, under the LIFE Third Countries programme 2005. These projects focus on capacity building. They represent a total investment of €9.223.000, of which the EU will cover €6,348,240.

The European Commission has selected 15 projects in Algeria, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Croatia, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Russia, Tunisia, Turkey, the West Bank and Gaza, for funding through the LIFE Third Countries programme. They cover a wide range of issues, from waste management and industrial pollution prevention and control to soil monitoring and climate change. Some projects promote a movement towards EU environmental regulations or co-operation at regional or transnational level.

The total cost of the projects amounts to €9.223.000. EU financing represents approximately 69% of this amount.

New funding initiatives: LIFE+ and the Competitiveness and Innovation Framework Programme (CIP)

In 2007, the programme LIFE III will be replaced by LIFE+ (€2.19 billion for 2007–2013). The thematic priorities of the programme, which supports the the priorities of the Sixth Environmental Action Programme, include climate change, nature and bio-diversity (including



the Natura 2000 network), environment and health, sustainable resource use, strategic approaches to policy development, and ex-post evaluation. Third country actions will no longer be financed under LIFE, but instead will be financed under the EU's external assistance programmes. Countries participating in LIFE+ will be Member states of the EU, European Economic Area (EEA) states, Iceland, Liechtenstein, and Norway. Western Balkan countries in the stabilization and accession process will be eligible. A wide variety of public and private sector organisations will likewise be eligible to apply for LIFE+ funding.

CIP will bring together all activities currently dispersed across MAP, LIFE-Environment, e-TEN, e-Content and the Intelligent Energy for Europe Programme. It will be more visible and comprehensible to the public while ensuring the continuity of programmes with proven track records. The three specific programmes under CIP will be

Entrepreneurship and Innovation Programme, which, among other things, will aim to help enterprises innovate by providing access to finance; and give SMEs simple, clear and efficient access to the EU – its legislation, programmes and opportunities via business support networks, including a separate IPR helpdesk.

ICT Policy Support Programme, which will stimulate the new converging markets for electronic networks, media content and digital technologies; test solutions to the bottlenecks that delay wide European deployment of electronic services; and support the modernisation of public sector services that will raise productivity and improve services.

Intelligent Energy-Europe Programme, which will encourage the wider uptake of new and renew-

able energies, improve energy efficiency, and foster compliance with the energy regulatory framework.



TOPICS

Pre-Accession Funds:

For the period up to 2006, the EU will provide support under the three pre-accession instruments to candidate countries: PHARE, ISPA, and SAPARD. These are vitally important, as they will have an impact on the candidate countries' economies, and cover such vital areas as transport, energy and the environment in general. Pre-accession funds will generate more money, therefore shaping the future of at least two major sectors in the accession countries - transport and environmental protection.

Structural Funds and the Cohesion Fund:

Structural Funds are the European Union's main instruments for supporting social and economic restructuring across the Union. ERDF covers all areas: transport, communication technologies, energy, the environment, research and innovation, social infrastructure, and others. The Cohesion Fund finances projects designed to improve the environment and develop transport infrastructure in Member States whose per capita GNP is 90% below of the Communitu average.

Community Initiatives:

Interreg III supports cross-border, transnational and transregional cooperation and regional development.

The Urban 2 Community Initative aims to support troubled urban districts of the EU. For the period 2000-2006 the total cost of these programmes is EUR 1.6 billion. Leader + is designed to help rural actors consider the long-term potential of their local region.





EIE - INTELLIGENT ENERGY FOR EUROPE

Intelligent Energy – Europe (EIE) is the Community's support programme for non-technological actions in the field of energy, energy efficiency and renewable energy sources. The programme mainly supports mid-term and long-term developments. The duration of the programme is from 2003–2006. The total operational budget of the EIE programme for the period of 2003–2006 is 215 + 50 million euros.

This call will be the **last opportunity for COOPENER** projects in the area of co-operation with developing countries under this current programme. There will also be two calls for events, one with a deadline to coincide with the main call and a second later in 2006. Proposals for events should be submitted at least 6-9 months before the event takes place.

The Commission is currently preparing the **third call** for proposals **under 'Intelligent Energy – Europe'**. The call is likely to be published towards the end of September 2005 and it will be **open until early 2006**.

Most thematic areas of the global work programme 2003-06 will be open for proposals. Final details of the 2005 call will be set out in the annual work programme for 2005, which is expected to be published in **August or September**.

LIFE-III

LIFE III (L'Instruments Financiers pour l'Environement), the Financial Instrument for the Environment, introduced in 1992, is one of the milestones of the European Union's environmental policy. LIFE is a horizontal legal instrument system, which has three main fields of activity. On the bases of these activities it tries to have an effect in all fields of the environmental protection and the preservation of nature.

LIFE co-finances environmental initiatives in the European Union and certain third countries bordering on the Mediterranean and the Baltic Sea and in Central and East European Accession Candidate Countries that have decided to participate in LIFE. The **duration** of the programme is from **2000–2006**. The total operational budget of LIFE III. programme for the period of 2000–2006 is 957 million euros.
